You Will Need


 Materials from your garden (e.g. grass, leaves, sticks, soil)

Mazes were used by Christians to make amends for sins. Travelling a maze represented a difficult journey. A much cheaper alternative to a pilgrimage to save the soul.

Instructions




- 1. Make the pattern (top left diagram) on the ground, with enough space to walk between each shape.
- 2. Join the top of the central cross to one of the L shapes (see bottom left diagram)
- 3. Continue by joining the next free end (A) to the free end on the other side (B)
- 4. Now join the next free end on the right (C) to the next free end on the left (D)
- 5. Continue joining the next free ends until all the ends are used up. The result will be the maze shown below.
